Creating a course



Course Creation is handled by the platform administration, and the courses are managed by Project Partners.

Email <u>support@bluerevproject.eu</u> with the request to create a new course, along with the course name and a general description of the contents that are meant to be added.

Soon, you will be given access to a hidden course with a simple structure that you can customise and add content to.



Settings

At course creation, all the most important settings will be configured for you, so you do not need to interact with the settings page beside for some key concepts.




Access the course settings to customise some key configurations:

The Course visibility is set to *Hide* initially.

Changing it to *Show* will reveal the course to all members of the platform.

Course end date, if *Enabled*, will automatically change the course visibility to *Hide* at the selected date

Important activities and resources

The basics of adding content and information on the most common activities and resources for Courses



Activate Editing mode



In order to create and manage contents for a course, you must activate Editing mode, by clicking on the toggle available on the top right of the page.

While Editing mode is on, you can edit the courses you have been assigned as a manager of.







Topics



At course creation, the course will have a few topics created. Each topic is in its own white box section.

Use topics to organise information, so it is easier to find by the trainees.

To add a new topic, while in editing mode, just click on the Add topic option at the end of each of the white boxes.






Adding activities and resources




Click on the button at the end of a topic to add an activity or resource within it.

Activities and Resources are the content that exist within a course, that can be accessed and interacted with by the trainees enrolled on a course.

Present text and multimedia directly on the course page. It is the main option if you wish to display information on the course page itself.

Video 1 and 2

Share resources by providing downloadable files. When possible, the file is displayed within the course interface; otherwise, users are prompted to download it.

You can add files to the course page through the activity and resources menu, or simply by dragging and dropping the files into the page, given that the editing mode is turned on




Folder



Allows for easy embedding of Youtube and Vimeo videos by simply adding the URL. Alternatively, a video file can be uploaded directly.











Marine Biotechnology

The application of biological techniques and processes to marine organisms for the development of new products, medicines, and technologies







Ocean Conservations

Efforts and strategies aimed at preserving marine ecosystems, biodiversity, and natural resources to ensure long-term ecological balance



Ocean Governance

The framework and regulations that guide the sustainable and responsible use of ocean resources, including policies related to fishing, shipping, and environmental protection



Ocean Renewable Energy

The generation of energy from marine resources, including tidal, wave, and ocean thermal energy, as a sustainable alternative to traditional energy sources

A note on activities and resources



The Moodle platform is known for its versatility, and as such it has avast array of functionalities. The Course activities and resources are no exception. For the Support Tool, there are many that are not useful, given the type of information they deals with.

As such, many functionalities are disabled, in order to simplify and focus the user interaction.

Other activities and resources are available, but are not likely to be as useful as the ones listed before. You can find information about them in the official documentation listed at the start of this document.

Other activities and resources

Assignment: Enables file submissions, along task communication, and grading. It supports various content types, including files and text, allowing both individual and group submissions.

Choice: Pose a single question and provide a set of response options. Results can be published post-response, after a specific date, or kept private. Results can be published either with names or anonymously.

Database: Create, maintain, and search a collection of entries with varied fields like short text, dropdown lists, URLs, images, or files.

Forum and **Open Forum**: Asynchronous discussions with various forum types, including standard, single-post, and question-and-answer forums. It supports file attachments, displaying images within posts. Both have similar functionalities but different structure.

Page: Create web page resources using the text editor, displaying text, images, sound, video, web links, and embedded code like Google maps.

Quiz: Create quizzes with diverse question types like multiple choice, matching, short-answer, and numerical. You can create time limits and other restrictions regarding the answering of the questions.

URL: Provide web links as course resources.

Wiki: Contribute to and edit a collection of web pages. Wikis can be collaborative, allowing everyone to edit, or individual, with each participant having their own editable wiki.
